Analysis

305 people collected their over 70's gift and 128 (42%) completed forms were received. Not everyone completed both sides of form or all questions.

Q1 – asked which of 22 items most needed improvement. The top 5 were:

- Road and pavement repairs (67%)
- Level of traffic congestion (66%)
- Clean streets (58%)
- Speeding (56%)
- Parking/Affordable housing (34%)
