



## **Chair of the Planning, Environment & General Purposes Committee Annual Report For 2025/26**

Membership of the committee has stayed stable over the past 12 months with many members continuing on from 2023/24. It is important to note that there is a good balance within the membership with some members with detailed knowledge of the planning process whilst others have a very deep knowledge of the township and its diverse need due to being resident for many years. The main role of the committee as a statutory consultee on planning issues affecting the township is to scrutinise new planning applications submitted to Kirklees Council and make representations to Kirklees planners with regards to any issues that we feel would have a negative impact on the local area and its residents.

To this end we invite the public to attend meetings if they so wish and we take note of any correspondence from residents concerning active planning applications. We would actively encourage residents to attend meetings in person if they feel that they have a concern over any planning issues affecting the area and a good number have done so over the past 12 months. Whilst not all of the concerns of residents fall within the scope of planning regulations it provides valuable context to the committee about local concerns.

On 25th March 2026, new plan-making regulations were brought into effect which introduced new requirements to commence preparation of a Local Plan: The Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2026. It is not yet clear what impact that the change of local plan will have in this area, and it will be important to keep abreast of any forthcoming changes to ensure that we make

representations where appropriate to protect our township and its green spaces. The published timetable for the preparation of this plan is set out in the document at the link below but the adoption of the new plan is not expected to happen until April 2029.

The work to keep on top of the town cleanup continued this year with reported areas of concern either addressed directly by the council or brought to the attention of relevant responsible bodies where appropriate. The committee has had input in to many of the projects being considered by the Town Council with regards to improving the facilities and amenities within the area and has fed this back into full council and other relevant committees.
